John Boyle enlisted at Carlisle, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, no definite date given, served as a private in Captains William Gesser<sup>d</sup> and Benjamin Fishbourne's companies, Colonel William Butler's Fourth Pennsylvania regiment; he was in the battles of Brandywine, Germantown, in Sullivan's expedition in 1778, in the battle of Newtown and in several skirmishes with the Indians, and was discharged in April, 1782.

He was allowed pension on his application executed, June 22, 1816, then a resident of Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania and aged about sixty-seven years.

In 1820 his wife, Elizabeth, was sixty-six years of age, and one John Boyle, Junior in 1820 was in Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania, his relationship to the family not stated. *The soldier John Boyle died June 24-1821*
